Pastor Stephanie's Reflections on

Making a Home for Faith: Nurturing the Spiritual Life of Your Children

I came across this wonderful book a few years ago while browsing the free bin outside McKay's Bookstore in Knoxville. I couldn't believe my luck because Elizabeth Caldwell spoke so beautifully to areas of Christian education that I had been pondering. The premise of this book is that parents and other loved ones are the primary theological educators of children.

While we professionals (including Caldwell herself) coordinate, guide, and inspire, many of the most important moments of spiritual formation will take place in the midst of family and home life.

Caldwell draws her scriptural inspiration from Deuteronomy 6:4–9 (NRSV), the first portion of which Jesus also invokes in his teachings (Matt 22:37; Mk 12:30; Lk 10:27): Hear, O Israel: The Lord is our God, the Lord alone. You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your might. Keep these words that I am commanding you today in your heart. Recite them to your children and talk about them when you are at home and when you are away, when you lie down and when you rise. Bind them as a sign on your hand, fix them as an emblem on your forehead, and write them on the doorposts of your house and on your gates.

Caldwell shares some of the tools that she has used over the years to help parents become more comfortable with their own faith so that they, in turn, will be prepared to have important spiritual conversations with their children as they arise in everyday life. These tools include crafting a personal faith statement (Chapters 2–3; Appendix 1 & 2); learning to be storytellers (Appendix 3); becoming comfortable with questions and basic theological concepts (Chapter 4); and creating a spiritual environ-

ment within one's home so that faith formation takes place as part of daily living (Chapter 5). She concludes her book with a categorized bibliography of resources for addressing these areas of discussion further (Chapter 6).

Caldwell helps her readers understand what kinds of questions will emerge at each stage of a child's development and what a child is searching for with his or her questions. She illuminates how faith questions contribute to a child's burgeoning sense of self and the development of her or his autonomy. Furthermore, she views narrative as central to a child's identity formation, "Identity comes from hearing stories and finding a place in them" (p. 51). Thus, hearing biblical stories as well as family stories help situate children in their world and help them determine what contribution they will make to it.

One of the most powerful ways to connect children with the stories of the Bible and their Christian faith is through celebrating and observing traditions connected to the liturgical year. Caldwell gives a broad overview of how recognizing the Christian seasons in your home (Advent, Christmas, Epiphany, Shrove Tuesday, Ash Wednesday, Lent, Holy Week, Easter, Pentecost, Ordinary Time) helps both parents/caregivers and children find continual meaning in the story of Jesus and in the story of the church all year long. Finding ways to inhabit each of these seasons is (in part) an anecdote to the letdown many in the U.S. feel at the end of Christmas Day. When we can see the extraordinary in every season, we spread out the excitement and the memorable rituals throughout the year, lessening the pressure of making Christmas carry so much of our need to create "perfect" family memories.
