The Weather Report

The ground was covered. The snow had done its work quietly and completely. Slippery surfaces necessitated that I move inside to complete my daily constitution.

The church facility and its numerous stairs allowed for thorough exercise. There was the opportunity for seeing and listening to this space too. The late Thomas Merton spoke of finding soul in place. There is in all visible things and invisible fecundity, a dimmed light, a meek namelessness, a hidden wholeness.1

As I walked through a specific area of the building, I was awash in reminders of the things that had transpired in its rooms and halls. Lapping the Fellowship Hall I recalled our life together around the tables sharing a meal. The room was set up for RITI that coming Thursday night, a ministry we cherish. The memory of certain individuals standing in that room to share an experience was especially sweet. A large grin perched upon my face.

The sanctuary was a treasury of poignant recollections. In this very room, worship has enriched those who gathered by faith. Memorable baby dedications, baptisms, weddings, and tender funerals have buoyed our hearts and infused our lives with meaning. Echoes of congregational singing and choral concerts resonated within me.

I believe this serendipitous change to my daily exercise regimen allowed me to perceive the "invisible fecundity" of our life together. I experienced some of the "hidden wholeness" that is grounded in the authentic and truest self of this congregation. I finished exercising with a large measure of gratitude for the family God is making of us. This prompted me to carry a copy of the church directory during my walk the following day, giving thanks for each individual listed as I walked.

Out of many, God makes a family. A regeneration that requires grace and leadership. Gratefully, God equips and calls people to serve. Many answer and faithfully work.

This month, we recognize two women who have faithfully tended the soul of our congregation. Marilyn Shadinger and Becky Atkinson have worked toward and lived into the authentic and truest self of our church for seventeen and ten years respectively. Their constancy, like a compass, has pointed to the magnetic north of God. Through excellence, they have led us and have flourished. Both are retiring from their respective positions as Associate Minister of Music and Parent's Day Out Director; we are eternally grateful.

On Sunday May 23 we will recognize Marilyn and Becky as a part of worship. I invite you to join me in expressing gratitude to them for their ministry through Immanuel Baptist Church. My respect for these two women is immense. I have learned by their example and through their way of seeing the world. I count it a joy to have worked alongside of them.



With the approval of the Stewardship Committee, IBC has recently purchased Realm, cloud-based church management software that will help our office staff better manage member information and accounting services. For members, it will allow you to access the church directory online, register and pay for events, and offer electronic giving options (online, text, and mobile). Realm will add additional giving options for members, but it won't change any of the giving options you are already using (such as bank drafts or check donations). Stay tuned for more information as we prepare to launch this exciting new resource.



PASSPORT

We're pleased to announce that seven Immanuel kids will attend Passportkids at Berea College in KY June 22-25. Chaperones will be Stephanie Wyatt and Andrew Tonks. Three Immanuel youth will attend Passport at Furman University in SC July 5-10. Chaperones will be Andrew Tonks and Abigail Reynolds.

This year's theme is "Story." Passport staff explain: we believe that the greatest Story is God's Story. Hebrews 12:2a says "Let us keep our eyes fixed on Jesus, who is the author of our faith and the one who brings it to its goal." Hear God's Story with Moses at the burning bush, sing God's Story as part of church worship, act God's Story as those who brought a man to Jesus, and continue to write God's Story as those who came before us. You are invited to immerse yourself in the ongoing Story of God. The greatest Story ever told will be continued...through you.

Lord's Supper Procedure

Beginning with Lord's Supper in May congregants who are comfortable doing so are invited to come forward to receive the elements of communion from pastoral staff, who will wear both masks and gloves. We are observing all recommended protocols from our healthcare professionals. If you do not feel comfortable taking communion in this way, you are welcome to use your own elements (a grape and cracker).



Six church members, along with Pstors Steven and Stephanie, have been participating in a video study based on Jemar Tisby's NY Times bestselling book, *Color of Compromise*. The author hosts the series, drawing viewers into a conversation about the roles white Christians have played in the history of racism in the United States. Tisby focuses on how institutional racism has affected the church and hindered the witness of the gospel. We watch each video at 7am on Tuesday mornings and then gather for discussion via Zoom. Discussions have been honest and substantial.

The pastoral staff views this study as a pilot program with hopes for more such discussion groups as restrictions on gatherings lift. In the meantime, if you are interested in the study but couldn't make the 7am meeting time, the video series is available through the church library on DVD as is Tisby's bestselling book that inspired the series.





Family VBS will take place this year, Tuesday-Thursday July 27-29 from 5pm to 8pm each evening. Families are invited to bring a picnic dinner for each night of programming. The theme this year will be the story of the biblical prophet Jonah. Thursday night will be water night for the kids. Each night will include some combination of story time, music, games, and crafts, or other story-related activity.

If you are not able to accompany your children, they may still attend, just let Pastor Stephanie know so that we have enough adults to chaperone and help with activities. Grandparents and other family members are happily welcome as well! If you would like to be a part of helping with VBS but are not a family member, we will be happy to have you.
