Pentecost & Ingathering June 5th

On Sunday June 5th during morning worship (10:30am), We will celebrate Pentecost. Each year we remember that after Jesus ascended to heaven post-resurrection, the Holy Spirit arrived to unite Jesus' followers once he could no longer be physically present with them on earth. Pentecost takes place 50 days (seven Sundays) after Easter.

You are invited to wear the colors of flames on Pentecost Sunday (red, orange, or yellow/gold) to commemorate the coming of the Holy Spirit to these early Christians.

In keeping with the harvest origins of the holiday in Judaism, whereby the faithful would bring the first fruits of their labor as offerings to the temple, we will be collecting food items for our spring ingathering this Pentecost.

We invite you to bring crushed tomatoes (red for Pentecost!) and whole wheat penne pasta. Our collection will benefit the Nashville Food Project. For those of you unfamiliar with this Immanuel tradition, bring your donations into the sanctuary with you. At a designated time you will be invited to bring your items forward to place in baskets at the altar.

Adam is married to Pastor Stephanie. You can find him many Sundays in the balcony working with the livestream.




Peter Vu, B.S.

PARDON THE INCONVENIENCE

From the Building & Grounds Committee

As a result of a recent settlement with our insurance carrier, work will begin sometime in June to replace the roofs on all areas of the church building. The duration of the ongoing work is indeterminate, likely several months, depending on availability of materials and weather conditions.

The bulk of the damaged areas was the result of several hail events in recent years. The cost of the shingled roof replacement is covered by the settlement.

Additionally, the church has approved replacement of the aging flat roof areas as part of the project. This work will be funded using a portion of our reserve funds.

While accomplishing this needed work is good news, such a large undertaking will likely cause interruptions to ingress and egress to certain entrances and parking areas at times. We will coordinate with the contractor to minimize the disruptions to the extent reasonable.
