AN UPLIFTING MESSAGE: OUR ELEVATOR NEEDS HELP

In early December, we were notified by our elevator servicing company that parts needed to maintain our elevator were no longer being manufactured and that repair parts needed to keep it in operating condition would soon be unavailable. The existing elevator was installed in 1988. While the elevator does not experience large traffic demands, it plays a vital role in allowing access to all areas of the church for those with limited mobility.



In order to hold the cost of the upgrades needed, it is proposed to salvage as much of the existing elevator components as practical. An example is the elevator car, that is, the portion in which passengers are transported. Still, the estimated cost of the upgrades is anticipated to be around \$108,500 instead of the approximately \$500,000 amount for a brand new elevator. The \$108,500 project includes systems such as fire alarm and air conditioning (heating), items not required in building codes when the existing elevator was installed. The Stewardship Committee has identified the various sources of funding available, such as undesignated gift accounts. However, additional gifts from the membership are welcomed, to

help fund the upgrade. When making your gift, please indicate "Elevator upgrade" on the memo line of the check.

In order to avoid an unexpected disruption and months of no service, the Building and Grounds Committee solicited the services of an elevator consultant to verify the recommendations of our service provider. He has concurred in the opinion. Refurbished parts were also explored and found to not be available. The consultant has further offered to be our coordinator in preparing bid documents and soliciting prospective bidders. He has offered these services at no cost to the church. The facilitator is Chip Duncan, a relative of Pastor Steven. We are grateful for his offer.

Bids are scheduled to be received on February 24th and, after review, we will award a contract. Thereafter, it is anticipated that the project will be






