

A Stewardship Moment:

## The A. J. Wheeler Charitable Trust

Early Immanuel members, Albert Johnson Wheeler and Mary Belle Wheeler, contributed significantly to missions activities. In his book, A History of Immanuel Baptist Church: 1887-1986, Dr. Gaye L. McGlothlen writes that, in 1872, Mr. Wheeler helped establish a neighboring mission to the Immanuel Mission. Mrs. Wheeler served as president of the Tennessee Women's Missionary Union for thirteen years from 1902 until 1915. Mr. and Mrs. Wheeler and their children were members of Immanuel when the 1913 building was built. Their names were included on the list of members that was enclosed in the cornerstone box of that building. That list, as well as the box, are displayed in the Heritage Room.

Mrs. Wheeler's missionary spirit was greatly admired by her family. A charitable trust was established in Mrs. Wheeler's memory after her death, naming Immanuel as one of three recipients. A. J. Wheeler's will of 1924 states:

"Twenty shares of the Gulf States Steel Co's stock are to be set aside as a permanent gift to God and the first one hundred dollars (100.00) of dividends to be given to the Woman's Missionary Union of the Immanuel Baptist Church, Nashville, Tennessee as an annual gift of Mrs. Mary Belle Wheeler to the reservoir of oil for the Lamp of God to send His rays into the darker recesses of the world."

As soon as the trust had sufficient funds, Immanuel began receiving this \$100 annual gift with the money going to the Lottie Moon Foreign Mission Offering, the Annie Armstrong Home Missions Offering and later, also to the Golden State Missions Offering. The trust will soon be closed since all of the money has been dispersed.

We are grateful for forward-looking members such as the Wheelers who have contributed to missions around the world. How remarkable that Immanuel has received this missions contribution for 95 years!



## Annual Appalachian Outreach Mission Trip

## March 27-29 • Jefferson City, TN

In September 2010, Immanuel sent a team of nine adults to East Tennessee to work with Appalachian Outreach doing home repair work. In 2014, youth began serving alongside adults on the annual Appalachian Outreach mission trip. The following year, for the first time, a child worked alongside teenagers and adults in Jefferson City. In 2019, we sent our largest team to date to serve with Appalachian Outreach: 32 volunteers ranging in age from preschool to senior adult! Our congregation can now count 76 women, men, teenagers and children who have worked with this pover-

ty-relief ministry in East Tennessee.

Our annual Appalachian Outreach mission trip is scheduled for March 27-29. We will be staying in a hotel near Jefferson City on Friday and Saturday nights, working with Appalachian Outreach on Saturday, and worshipping at First Baptist Church in Jefferson City on Sunday morning. Our tasks have not yet been finalized, but we will likely be sorting donations at A.O.'s warehouse, cleaning the Samaritan House, and hosting dinner along with an Easter egg hunt for the guests of the Samaritan House.

Susan Crownover and Emily Gnetz will be coordinating the A.O. trip plans this year. If you are interested in participating, please contact Susan or Emily. Volunteers will be responsible for the hotel costs and two meals.

## Deacon Nomination Process Begins

The three-week period for nominating deacons to replace those completing their current terms begins January 19. During that time all Immanuel members will have the opportunity to nominate up to five members to "assist the church in the accomplishment of its total mission."

- Deacon Role and Function: Collecting the offering, serving the Lord's Supper, and looking after a deacon care group may be the most noticeable services they perform, but according to our Bylaws, the active deacons also work with the pastor and staff "with the goal of guiding the church and its members in worship, in service and ministry, and in effective use of the church's personal and corporate resources." They also serve "as advisors to the congregation, pastor, and staff in all areas of the church's life. They plan, review, evaluate, and recommend to the congregation proposals for improving the effectiveness of the church's worship, witness, education, ministry, and fellowship."
- Nomination forms (ballots): Shortly before January 19, deacon nomination forms will be distributed at church and by email. Anyone who needs to have a form sent by mail should contact the church office. For quick reference, a list of resident church members who, as of January 19, are eligible to serve as deacon will be distributed with the nomination forms. The same list will be posted on the bulletin board beside the library. (For a more complete discussion of qualifications, see Article III Section 6 of the Bylaws at right.)
- Nomination period: Nominations may be submitted anytime from Sunday, January 19, through Sunday noon, February 9. After prayerful consideration, all members are asked to recommend up to five people they believe to be best qualified. Each member should fold the unsigned nomination form, place it in an envelope, then seal the envelope, print his/her name on the outside, and drop it in one of the two ballot boxes (near the church office and near the library), place it in the Sunday morning offering plate, or mail it to the church office in time to be received no later than Friday, February 7. Forms may also be submitted on Sunday, February 9, until noon.
- And then: A tabulating committee composed of outgoing deacons will check names to be sure the voter is a member, separate ballots from envelopes so that privacy is ensured, then unfold ballots and prepare a list of nominees ranked according to number of nominations received. The church administrative staff will pass the

resulting list of nominees to the Committee on Deacons. The Committee on Deacons will contact the nominees, in order of nominations received, asking them to consider serving for three years beginning May 1, and inviting them to meet with the Committee before accepting or declining. A slate of five nominees who have accepted the call to serve will be presented for approval at the annual business meeting in April.

• Now: Please pray for God's guidance as we join together in this significant church-life process.

## Article III, Section 6 of Bylaws

Eligibility and Qualification of Deacons. To be eligible for service as a deacon of Immanuel Baptist Church, persons at the time the deacon ballots are distributed pursuant to Article V, Section 2 of these bylaws shall: (1) be a resident member of Immanuel Baptist Church; (2) be at least twentyfive years of age; (3) have been a member of Immanuel Baptist Church for at least one year; (4) have actively participated in the life of the church, by being a member of a church committee or being elected to a church office (i.e., treasurer, Sunday School teacher, etc.), at some point within the three years preceding their nomination; and (5) have financially supported the church, either personally or through their family giving unit, during each year of their membership or during each of the three years preceding their nomination, whichever period of time is shorter. Deacons should reflect those qualities that the church expects of its members including regular church attendance and financial support of the church. Persons nominated to serve as deacons should also agree to commit their time to serve a deacon care group, to attend deacons' meetings regularly, and to study carefully the teachings of scripture before agreeing to serve. They also should examine the church covenant as an expression of what the church calls each of its members to be and to do.

## RECOMMENDATION **Denominational Relations Committee**

Given the findings described above and in keeping with historic Baptist principles, the DRC recommends that effective May 1, 2020:

- IBC exercise its autonomy as a local church by withdrawing as a collective body from any formal association with the Cooperative Baptist Fellowship, the Southern Baptist Convention, and their state and local affiliates (i.e. Tennessee Cooperative Baptist Fellowship, Tennessee Baptist Convention, and Nashville Baptist Association).
- 2. Members of IBC exercise their priesthood as a believer in choosing whether or not to financially support the work of any Baptist organization, program, or institution through their direct funding of that entity.\*
- IBC budgeted missions will include only those local, regional, national, and international ministries recommended by the Missions Committee and approved by the church.
