# Church Votes to Initiate Capital Campaign

At a called business meeting on Sunday, February 17, the church approved initiating a capital campaign to raise \$200,000 to fund the replacement of the upper windows in the sanctuary, as well as other needed projects related to the sanctuary area.

Due to the significant deterioration of the upper windows, their replacement will be the first project addressed. This will include removal of the exterior shutters. In addition, window sills of the lower windows will be repaired.

Painting of some areas, plaster repairs, carpet and pew cleaning,

replacement of some light fixtures, and removal of several pews are other projects this campaign will address.

## Civil Rights Road Trip to Alabama









On the day that the Haiti mission trip was cancelled due to civil unrest, Pastor Steven and Pastor Tambi began planning an alternative trip for our four high school seniors, who were disappointed that they would not be able to travel to Haiti. The result was a two-day Civil Rights Road Trip to Alabama. On this memorable trip, the group visited the enlightening Civil Rights Institute in Birmingham, walked across the historic Edmund Pettus Bridge in Selma, and toured the powerful Legacy Museum and the moving National Memorial for Peace and Justice in Montgomery.

## UPDATE ON THE HAITI MISSION TRIP

The week before we were scheduled to fly to Haiti, our mission team was registered with the U.S. State Department. Shortly thereafter, we began to receive security alerts regarding scattered demonstrations in Haiti. The number of email alerts rapidly escalated, as Haitians took to the streets to demand the resignation of their president. The protests turned violent as young people expressed their discontent with the ongoing economic crisis and evi-

dence of political corruption.

Two days before our planned departure, our partners at The Joseph School called off the trip due to safety concerns. No mission trip is without risk, but the risk in Haiti in mid-February was far too high. The ten of us had been anticipating this mission trip for months, and our disappointment was palpable. Four duffel bags full of school supplies would remain at the church; the tools we had gathered to construct bookshelves for the school would go unused.

We have tentatively rescheduled the mission trip for May 2-6; we will be monitoring the situation in Haiti over the next few months to ensure that such a trip is viable. If you are interested in being a part of this team, let Pastor Steven or me know. In the meantime, I would encourage you to pray for the students and staff at The Joseph School. Our mission team was able to avoid placing ourselves in harm's way by simply cancelling our flights; these precious children and their devoted teachers

## Would You Like to Say "Goodbye" to Writing Checks and Save a Little Postage?

Use Online Bill Pay to make a weekly, monthly, or yearly contribution to Immanuel Baptist Church. You can schedule your contribution and select the date or dates you would like IBC to receive your contribution. It can be on the same day each month, week, or year!

Here's how you do it:

- 1) Go to the tab labeled **Payments** on your online banking website.
- 2) Select **Pay Bill** (This is not how IBC sees your contribution, but for a bank it is considered a bill!)
- 3) The bank will ask you to add a company or a person. Click on that tab and select **Charities**.

That is all you have to fill in. Select **Save Changes** and it will take you back to the original screen.

- 4) The bank will ask which of your accounts you want to use to make your payment. It will give you a scroll down of all of the accounts you have with the bank when you select the tab.
- 5) Next, enter the amount you would like to contribute and then it will ask for the date for delivery. This can be a one-time contribution or you can select Autopay and set it up as a recurring contribution.
- 6) Autopay will ask the amount and the frequency of the payment (weekly, every 2 weeks, monthly, or annually).
- 7) The bank will also ask for the length of time you would like this payment to occur. The bank will give you several options.
- 8) Your bank will then ask if you would like an email each time a contribution is sent.
- 9) At that time you will be asked if you are ready to start sending payments.
- 10) The bank will send the check to the church several days prior to the date you select so it always arrives on time.

What an easy way to make your contribution to the church!! No more writing checks!

#### The History of our

Lord's Supper Silver

Once a month we observe the Lord's Supper, using some historically significant silver that reminds us of our church's history. Pastor Steven uses the silver tray, chalice, and pitcher each service.





In 1887, Mrs. B. H. Stief gave the silver pitcher, chalice, and tray from her family's jewelry store. It was used during Immanuel's first Lord's Supper, January 1, 1888, twelve days after the church was organized.



Engravings on the juice tray lid of our current communion ware read: "Presented to Immanuel Baptist Church in loving memory, April 22, 1962."

The names of seven church members are engraved around the edges. This gift was given to commemorate the 75th anniversary observance.



Our newest serving pieces represent our present and future. The juice trays are pecan wood and the bread baskets are woven grass. These are used during our Maundy Thursday services.

Thanks be to God for the legacy shared with us from Immanuel's past and for the opportunities in our future.
