"...Because he was skillful at it."

In 1st Chronicles Chapter 15 we learn a lot about how much care King David put into the preparation of music for worship. It is easy to get lost in the names, but let these names highlight for us the detail and specificity that went into the design for music in the temple and the worship of God:

"David told the leaders of the Levites to appoint their relatives as singers to lift up their voices with joy, accompanied by musical instruments-harps, lyres, and cymbals. So the Levites appointed Heman son of Joel; from his brothers, Asaph son of Berechiah; from their brothers the Merarites, Ethan son of Kushaiah; and with them their brothers next in rank: Zechariah, Jaaziel, Shemiramoth, Jehiel, Unni, Eliab, Benaiah, Maaseiah, Mattithiah, Eliphelehu, Mikneiah, and the gatekeepers Obed-Edom and Jeiel. The musicians Heman, Asaph, and Ethan were to sound the bronze cymbals. Zechariah, Aziel, Shemiramoth, Jehiel, Unni, Eliab, Maaseiah, and Benaiah were to play the harps according to Alamoth. And Mattithiah, Eliphelehu, Mikneiah, Obed-Edom, Jeiel, and Azaziah were to lead the music with lyres according to sheminith. Kenaniah, the head Levite, was the director of the singing because he was skillful at it."

There is a lot of insight in this short passage for us as we think about the care that is taken in the preparation of the music presented in our worship. Consider the words alamoth and sheminith in the above passage. Scholars have speculated that these were specific theory systems used for these instruments. So, the lesson here is that they were not just to play these instruments, but they were to play according to a specific set of guidelines. Then consider the orchestration used: bronze cymbals, harps, lyres, and singing. Once again, the specificity is calculated and exact instruments are designated along with the number of players.

What captures my attention most is that specific individuals are identified for the leading of the music: Zechariah, Jaaziel, Shemiramoth (I wonder if friends called him "Shem"), Benaiah, and so on. But if you stay with this passage to the end, you get the real take-home for this musical guidebook: Kenaniah was to be in charge of the singing "because he was skillful at it."

A skill is the ability to do something well. We are blessed at Immanuel Baptist Church to have a legacy that includes musicians that do music very well. It is a joy and honor to work with all of these fine musicians as we prepare to lead worship through the gift of music, and we are thrilled to start adding new musicians to this legacy to perpetuate this legacy that dates back to King David.

70 Years Ago This Month...

The property at 222 Belle Meade Boulevard was dedicated by church members on September 30, 1951. The first photo of the dedication shows the Thomas H. Malone, Jr. home prior to any construction.

After pondering a decision to relocate for 31 years, in 1950 Immanuel voted to purchase this large residence and approximately seven acres for \$54,000. From 1951 until 1954 Sunday services were held in the house as well as at the downtown site. The construction of the sanctuary (current chapel) and educational wing began in 1953. The new space was dedicated on December 19, 1954. This sanctuary with the Malone home in the background is shown in the second photo.

The Thomas H. Malone, Jr. home remained in use until it was demolished to construct the office wing in 1987, the church's 100th anniversary year. —Charles Businaro, Church Historian

You may sign-up via an email sent from the church or via the sign-up sheet on the Room in the Inn bulletin board outside the sanctuary entrance. Thank you in advance.


