# Stewardship Committee: Update on Capital Campaign

It has been six months since the church approved a capital campaign to raise \$200,000 to fund the replacement of the upper windows in the sanctuary, as well as several other needed projects. The Stewardship Committee has reviewed our giving to the Campaign and the expenditures on completed projects.

By May 1, 2019, \$125,635 had been pledged to the Sanctuary Renovation; as of August 12, 2019, the total amount pledged had increased to \$135,110. This total of \$135,110 represents about 65% of the campaign goal of \$200,000.

It is heartening to note that Immanuel members began giving quickly and generously to this campaign. With the monies given, several projects included in this effort have now been completed. A major part of the campaign was the purchase and installation of new sanctuary windows, and by the end of July this was accomplished. Painting projects in several areas of the sanctuary and entry rooms were completed and have refreshed the appearance and beauty of the sanctuary. Other completed tasks include: shutter removal, electrical and lighting update, carpet repair and pew removal.

The Stewardship Committee is grateful for the church's generous giving to this Capital Campaign. Although we have a relatively small congregation, Immanuel Baptist has a large heart for giving, both in its financial resources and its efforts for service. It is our committee's hope that the additional completed pledges and gifts will allow the completion of the remaining renovation projects. In 2 Corinthians 9:7, we find: "Each of you should give what you have decided in your heart to give, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver."
